# Challenge / Excitement!

We often hear the phrase 'Mothers' Union is an organisation founded on Prayer' which is seen to include Midday Prayers, not only at meetings but every day from Mary Sumner House on Facebook. But I suspect that many of you have a routine which includes time for individual prayer.
